Frequently Asked Questions:

Who Can Enter?

Any *current* ASID Student Member or Allied Member in the 1st year of their practitioner membership may enter – but only work that was done during their time as a student in a Colorado ID Program. Membership status WILL be checked against the National database.

Can a team enter?

Yes. But, if the project is a team, at least ONE ASID Colorado member must be on the team. That member must be listed as Entrant 1.

The entry form only has space for 2 entrants, but we have more than that on the team.

What do we do?

Email epac@co.asid.org We can add Entrants to the form. Just tell us how many entrant spots you need.

How many Entries can I submit?

There is no limit to the number of entries you can submit.

What do I enter?

Enter Class projects, Team Projects, Capstone/Senior projects, Freelance work, Internship work (with employer's permission, of course)

How do I submit?

First, you fill in the Entrant Data Form. It is an editable PDF form, so once you have everything filled out, save it with Entrant 1's Last Name and MM/DD of your birthday (ie: Jan 6 = 0106)

Then open the Powerpoint file. If you do not have Powerpoint, there are other presentation software packages that should be able to open it and allow you to modify the file to complete your entry. (Keynote for Mac, Open Office, Prezi and SlideDog come to mind) As long as they allow you to open our file and save it as a PDF, you're good to go.

Finally, when all that is done, send us an e-mail at epac@co.asid.org Include your Entrant Data Form and the PDF of the Powerpoint as attachments. Use your Entrant number in the subject line.

What is the deadline?

The 2021 deadline to send back your Entrant Data Form and your PDF of the Presentation is Midnight Friday, August 5th. The submission window is open NOW.

Are there categories?

No. The top 3 project scores as judged by our panel will win.

There is one people's choice that will be voted on in person.

How are the winners selected?

The judges will be given 100 points to divide up as such: Design Intent: 30 points, Design Execution: 60 points and Quality of Submittal: 10 points. They will be analyzing your ability to communicate both in written format and visually. This is the same Judging Criteria that has been used for years to judge the Crystal Awards.

Who is judging?

We don't know that yet, but we probably wouldn't tell you their names anyway. The judges will all be Professional or Allied Members of ASID Colorado.

How do we find out if we've won?

Come to the in-person event on September 29th 6-8pm. If you are unable to attend, we will contact Entrant 1.

What do we win?

There are 4 \$200 Cash Prizes, 3 top scoring projects and one people's choice. Each Prize is Sponsored by one of the Chapter Celebration Host Sponsors + ASID Colorado. In the event that a team wins one of the prizes, the \$200 award will be divided evenly among the members of the team.

What happens after that?

First, the Chapter will share the information with our members through our various outlets; social media, newsletters and such. We will not be stingy with our praise.

Then, very shortly after Chapter Celebration, Denver Life will interview each winner (or winning team) and do a profile of each in the Home & Garden Issue of Denver Life. That's a REALLY BIG DEAL for you!

Then, your School (and possibly your parents, friends, family and co-workers) gets to brag all over you. Win-Win all the way around.
